Council Highlights

- The next Council meeting is scheduled for 10 Feb conflicting with our Youth mtg. It was agreed to have our next meeting on 10 Feb but starting at 6:00 p.m.
- Lenten Pancake Supper is scheduled for 12 Feb. High School youth were requested to flip pancakes. Youth Board agreed we could recruit a half dozen youth to help out. Also, a couple freshman girls are needed for face painting.
- Youth Committee ended up with \$372 carryover from 2001. Craig will add that to the 2002 Youth Budget for Workcamp.
- The St. Patrick Day's party is scheduled for March 16th. Craig proposed as a fundraising event, the youth sponsor a "Babysitting Night" at church where parents could drop off their children before going to the party. Charge would be something like \$20 for the first child and \$5 for each additional. The Youth Board said that was doable.
- The annual church Picnic is scheduled for June 16th. Craig suggested starting a "Battle of the Ages" venue beginning at the Picnic where there are contests throughout the year between the adults and the youth. The Youth Board agreed to the concept.
- The Property Committee requested we link the new Church website to the www.christ-the-king-lutheran.org website. Craig will ask Antonia will send info on the domain name to Craig.
- Antonia asked if the High School youth would be interested in a Sunday School session on Hunger 101 like was done during Confirmation two years ago. The Youth Board agreed that it would be interesting.
- It was suggested we add a Kid's page to the Youth Website. Craig will pursue.
- Gloria Rossbach is holding a Bologna Sandwich making event on 24 Feb. Craig to add to calender.

Anita's Report

Anita passed out her monthly staff report. Of note, she is starting to take youth one on one to Starbucks as a way of getting to develop more personal relationships out side of the church setting.

Calendar of Events:

- National Cathedral Lock-in: Anita is taking 5 of the Youth Leadership Board to this overnight event as a combination of team building and learning.
- D.C. Talk Concert: About a half dozen youth have signed up for the concert.
- Duck Pin Bowling: Good sign up (over 20) for this Christ Crusader event. Anita has coordinated with Steve Wilson. This could become an annual event.
- Souper Bowl Blitz: Anita will be out of town. Antonia is working the Blitz details.
- Souper Bowl Sunday: Anita will recruit a youth to organize this fundraising event.
- College Care Packages: Anita will recruit a youth to organize.

- Ski Trip: On track. Higher turnout than last year for High School; need more for Confirmation. Steffanie, Jackie and Megan are organizing and buying the food for the High School house. Anita refining the details e.g. transportation.
- Youth Congress: A new event for CTK that could become an annual event. Held in VA Beach with a few thousand youth attending. Several high school youth have expressed interest in going. It was agreed to subsidize this event. Anita has the lead.
- Car Wash: Don Boone to reserve weekends. Committee needs to recruit someone to take the lead.
- Langley Women's Varsity Basketball game: As an impromptu event, Craig has offered to take a few youth to the 18 Jan game to cheer on Nikki Kiffe and Nichole Rogowsky.

Youth Leadership Board

Four board members attended for the first time and provided valuable insight into planning. Craig asked if Sunday School classes are better with small groups or a single large group. There was divided opinion. It was recommended when the large group is broken down into small groups, one of the leadership board members be assigned to each small group to encourage participation.
